Everett has coached David Meador every year in some form of tournament play since 1994. He has also coached Jim Baker in several fund raising events.

With Everett as his coach, David has finished in the top five in every tournament played and they won the National Championship played in Columbus, GA. in 2011. They also won the Guiding Eyes Classic (The Masters of Blind Golf) in 2005 and 2009.

Everett has served graciously and effectively for several years on three important USBGA committees: Hall of Fame Committee, Annual Election Committee, and continuously as the USBGA Handicap Chair. The latter position requires working in concert with Mr. Doug Stoutley of the International Blind Golf Association. Everett reviews each scorecard, hole-by-hole, for scoring errors and adjustments, and calculates handicaps for all USBGA members for all sanctioned tournaments. He also keeps a backup set of records for all IBGA members.

Everett is helping either David Meador or Jim Baker almost every week with computer issues or Board administrative matters on his computer or in their homes. He also unselfishly drives them to appointments and other errands, to tournaments, youth clinics and speaking engagements out of town and even out of state. Additionally, Junior Blind Golf Clinics have seen Everett involved with hands-on coaching of kids and with training of other coaches.

In short, Everett Davis has been very involved in many aspects of the United States Blind Golf Association. His total hours given to the Association, while not recorded, will rival those of any coach in our history.

Everett has been married to Judy for 51 years. They have two children and two grandchildren.
